
CHEMISTRY CLUB


a Father and Son Sports Night. The annual alumni banquet also proves to be eventful and entertaining to the "old alums" and new lettermen alike.








Although the five win, three loss record of the 1955 Blue Devils may not do justice to it, this season was one of the finest Kenmore has had in its football history. Under the superb guidance of Coach Jules Yakapovich, the team ran up a combination of 2,174 yards of rushing and 183 yards of passing for an outstanding total of 2,357 yards. The season opened with a hotly contested battle against our traditional rivals, the Lumberjacks of North Tonawanda. Even though Kenmore led in rushing, passing, and number of first downs, the score at the end of the game contradicted with a 7-0 victory for N. T. After downing Lockport and Tonawanda in quick succession, the team traveled to the Cataract city to play a well-coordinated Niagara Falls eleven. Even with the greatest of effort, things just didn't click, and the game ended 14-0, with Niagara Falls on top. After La Salle and Trott were submerged in succession, Dick Barnaby, scoring 18 points altogether, plunged over for a last-minute tally to defeat Jamestown, 25-21. The season came to a close with the tight heart-breaker

with Lackawanna. On an extremely muddy field in the Lackawanna stadium, our team was defeated by the spirited Steelers in a drizzling rain, 13-6. Thus the season ended.

Outstanding during the season were Dick Barnaby, with a phenomenal total of 1,115 yards rushing and an average per carry of 7.77 yards; and Dave Watson with an average of 6.54 yards per carry. On the line, Captain Sam Sanders, Sunny Winters, and Bill Wardwell gave opposing teams food for thought. Three Kenmore players attained high honor in being selected for the first string All-League team: Dick Barnaby, Sunny Winters, and Captain Sam Sanders, with Dave Watson placing on the second string. We pass on the fighting spirit of the football Blue Devils to the 1956 squad under the leadership of Captain-elect Ed Sill, and hope that next season will be as successful as our great school deserves.




"It was a long, cold winter" is a familiar phrase voiced by Mr. Michael Stark.


they were upset by a strong Olean nine in the final round of the Section Six championship.
