## **Key Vocabulary & Definition:**

**Escape:** break free from confinement or control

- Old rags or paper towels


- Newsprint to cover work area

# **Home-Made Animal Masks**


# **Getting Set Up**:


- 1. Cover work area with Newsprint.
- 2. Cut down the center seam on one side of a brown paper bag.
- 3. Cut out the bottom to unfold a long piece of brown paper.
- 4. Measure 28 inches long and cut off the remaining paper.
- 5. To make a half mask make the vertical height 9 ½ inches.
- 6. To make a full mask make the vertical height between 14-to17th inches.



- \*Think about eye placement on the paper, a horse might have the eyes high, a rabbit might need to have eyes lower to make room for the ears.
- 8. Fold paper in half so you have each eye dot on either side.
- 9. Take your scissors and gently push through both pieces of paper to make a very small peep hole.
- 10. If you are making a half mask, cut an almond shape, 1 ½ inches about from the small hole you have in your folded paper. Start small, you can always go back and make them larger.
- 11. If you are making a larger mask keep your peep holes small since they will blend into your animal's face.







### Time to decorate your mask:

- 1. Bold patterns work best on brown paper. Think: stripes, polka dots, blobs, scribbles, what ever your animal needs for horns, hair, fur, fangs, or scales.
- 2. You can start by drawing out what you like with a Pencil and then go back into it with ink or paint. The advantage of the a brown paper bag is it can take a lot.
- 3. Feel free to adorn your mask further with embellishments like frayed left over paper, glue on string, yarn, pasta, whatever you have on hand.
