
### KENITORIAL STAFF


#### Y-TEEN




#### **SANS SOUCI**





#### **ORCHESTRA**





#### **CONCERT BAND**





#### **THESPIANS**






## Tinsel Ball


#### **BOOSTER CLUB**




#### **CO-ED BADMINTON**

#### **CO-ED SWIM**





#### CO-ED SWIM




#### **BOYS' BOWLING**






## **CHEMISTRY CLUB**





#### **DEBATE CLUB**



#### **SCHOLARSHIP CLUB**



These are the ideals of Varsity Club, one of the most highly regarded organizations of Kenmore High. Prerequisites for membership include the winning of a letter in any one of the seven varsity sports. The Club meets as a gym class three times a week, one period of which is devoted to a business meeting. Among the many varied activities of this group are co-sponsoring the Football Dance, selling football and basketball programs and pencils, holding Parents' Days in most of the sports, sponsoring a Father and Son Sports' Night, and presenting the annual alumni banquet.

This year's officers were Reg Newman, President; George Davis, Vice-President; Jim Estey, Secretary; Bill O'Neil, Treasurer; and Bob Faulks, Sergeant-at-arms. Under the supervision of Mr. Bollier and the excellent leadership of its president, Varsity Club this year has certainly flourished in size, influence, and accomplishment.



#### FOOTBALL

The 1954 Blue Devils opened the N.F.L. season with an impressive 28-6 grid decision over Lockport on our own field. The pre-season favorites subdued the Lions with George Davis, all-league fullback, and quarterback Reg Newman paving the way by scoring two touchdowns apiece. The team then traveled to face a strong Tonawanda eleven. Once again our boys were victorious, winning by the score of 27-12. George Davis played the best game of his career for his alma mater. He set up a touchdown on a 70 yard burst, and later he galloped 45 yards for a T.D. Reg Newman was consistently hitting his ends with passes and keeping the Tonawanda defense off balance with his fine execution of running plays. Big Bob Faulks and Sam Sanders were standouts for Kenmore in their fine line play. The Blues then traveled to Niagara Falls in quest of their third straight victory. Over 1,000 rooters went to the Cataract City to witness this game, one of the most exciting ever played in the area. Our boys came out on top by a score of 20-15 in a long, uphill fight. George Davis scored in the last minute of play to pull the game out of the fire. Our boys then met a strong LaSalle team on our Junior High field, which was in the most adverse playing condition. The Explorers upset our boys by a score of 13-7, but the following week we took the loss out on Dunkirk. We outplayed, outran and outscored the team from Dunkirk by a score of 31-13. Jack Elmore played a magnificent ball game with his running. We then traveled to Trott to engage the Engineers in a muddy battle. Once again we tasted victory as the injured George Davis came off the bench to score two touchdowns. The final score was 19-6. After an intermission of seven days, our boys met head on with N.T., our traditional rival. The Lumberjacks dealt our boys their second and last defeat of the season by a score of 14-6. We finished a well-played year by blanking Lackawanna by a score of 13-0.

George Davis and Captain Bill O'Neil were repeaters on the All-League teams, while Bob Faulks entered the charmed circle for the first time; Stu Zimmerman and Sam Sanders made the second team. Honorable mention went to the following Blues: Lynn Small, Sunny Winters, Bill Wardwell, Jack Elmore, Reg Newman, Dick Farmer, and Tom King. Congratulations "fellas." We're all proud of you and what you did for Kenmore, and we fully realize this would have been impossible without the superb coaching ability of Jules Yakapovich. We sincerely wish Captainelect Sam Sanders the best of luck with next year's team.

Pete Bloomer, Fred Gacek, Joe Gauthier, Gary Hedlund and Ron Haeger returning, the team was able to tie for first place with Niagara Falls in the N.F.L. Our "Sammy Sneads" were victorious in all their matches with one exception: that being at the hands of Niagara Falls in a very close game. However, they avenged that defeat later in the season by whipping the Falls' team by a large score.


#### **TENNIS**



The Kenmore J.V. basketball team had a very successful season this year under the fine coaching of Mr. Stark.


