


FOREWORD


When time has rendered our school days but a memory and our present life is but a chronicle for the future to view in retrospect, it is our hope that we will have shown ourselves to good advantage.


respectively.

Then came class day with its consequent awarding of letters, honors, and scholarships. The Senior Ball came and went as only


a glorious reminder of our still more glorious past.




Let's take a stroll along the fabulous midway and watch the Junior Performers rehearing under the Big Top.

ties have been outstanding and successful.



Without the financial aid given to us by the Student Council, our dance proceeds, and its support, this book would never have


been published.

VARSITY FOOTBALL


A hard-fought 19 to 12 victory over Lackawanna in the final game of the season enabled our Varsity Blue Devils to finish for the third consecutive year in second place in the Niagara Frontier League. Their fine record of five victories and two defeats—equalled by that of the afore-mentioned Steelers—was surpassed only by North Tonwawanda's perfect mark of seven victories and no defeats.

Following the upset at the Falls, Kenmore conquered LaSalle and Lackawanna to conclude a successful season under "Jules" Yakapovich in histst year as head coach.

When post-season honors were distributed, Kenmore go its share as six players earned selection to the N. F. L. All Sta Team. 





Kenmore's '51 squad under the guiding hand of Coach Wessel promises to bring many more honors to Kenmore High School.



Kenmore's Varsity Golf team bounced back from a disastrous '49 season and stroked its way into a tie for second place in the N.F.L.






TRACK


The 1950 Varsity Track season was one that saw many outstanding performances and three record-breaking feats by our boys in Blue.
