



PROLOG



Good luck to you next year, Juniors. May you have as good a time being Seniors as the Class of '49 had this year.





Clubs may come, and clubs may go, but the Co-ed Swim Club, capably guided by Miss Kauffman and Mr. Palmer will always be with us.




AQUACADE

J. V. FOOTBALL


The junior varsity Blue Devils of Kenmore High fought their way through six rugged games in their 1948 season to come out unbeaten and in first place in their league.




In the second round we again splashed to victory over Amherst, Niagara Falls, and Lockport,

but met defeat at the hands of Tonawanda and North Tonawanda.




"B" SWIMMING TEAM






a 2-2 deadlock.






TUMBLING


