









Mr. Frank C. Densberger

THE American West, which forms the underlying theme of this year's Kenitorial, was made the thriving prosperous region that it is today by a courageous, forwardlooking group of pioneers. Similarly, Kenmore's rapidly expanding school system had earned its high reputation through the efforts of pioneers in education. Among the foremost of these are Frank C. Densberger and Roy G. Freeman, both of whom

have retired this year.


Mr. Densberger, a graduate of Syracuse and Columbia Universities, came to Kenmore High School as supervising principal in 1915. Two years later he became Superintendent of schools in Kenmore, and has retained that position since then. Throughout his years as superintendent, Mr. Densberger has capably handled the difficult task of anticipating the educational needs of a mushrooming population. He has carried out a building program which has given Kenmore some of the finest school buildings and equipment in the state. An outstanding factor in Mr. Densberger's policies has been his keen understanding of the pupils' needs. Recognizing the advantages of a junior high school system, he became one of its early advocates; since 1925 Kenmore has been functioning very successfully on the 6-3-3 basis. For his contributions to education, Mr. Densberger had the honor of being the first to receive the Buffalo State Teachers College award to an outstanding educator.




Mr. Roy G. Freeman

ROY G. FREEMAN, who has been principal of Kenmore High School since 1925, was graduated from St. Lawrence and Columbia Universities. Before becoming principal he was vice-principal and a teacher of science and mathematics at Kenmore for seven years. Under Mr. Freeman's guidance, Kenmore High School has functioned smoothly for many years. His understanding and sympathetic attitude has always guaranteed him the respect and affection of both students and faculty. To Mr. Freeman, every pupil was an individual, and he tried to treat each one individually, even though Kenmore's large enrollment in recent years made this virtually impossible. He took great interest in the welfare of the students, and was eager to help them personally in any way possible. Through frequent visits to classes and personal interviews with students, he always kept in close contact with school activities.

Both of these educational pioneers will be greatly missed by all those who have been privileged to work with them during their years of service in the Kenmore school system. Because of their efforts we are able to attend one of New York State's most modern and highly rated schools. It is with deep pride that we dedicate the Kenitorial of 1953 to Frank C. Densberger and Roy G. Freeman.

### **CLASS HISTORY**

That September morning when the Class of 1953 first approached the Bar K as a motley assortment of tenderfeet has faded into the dim past. To us the ranch seemed a fearsome place occupied by lofty cowhands much older than ourselves, stern foremen, and endless halls filled with stubborn lockers which responded only to energetic kicks accompanied by equally forceful words. However, after a few weeks, when we had won the general approval of the foremen (with a few widely scattered exceptions) and the older hands treated us less like uninteresting amoebae, we began to feel more at home. We even managed to take an active part in extracurricular activities, despite the rigors of following Caesar through Gaul and memorizing the "Mercy Speech."

We elected Dave Foster, Sally Trumble, Phil Morey, and Marilyn Wilson as Sheriff's deputies that year; Mr. McIntyre became our advisor. The highlight of our term as tenderfeet came in April, when we presented a parody on show business as our contribution to the Ranch's entertainment. It was welcomed as an innovation in Ranch performances, and the prestige of the tenderfeet rose considerably.

As the year came to an end, there was a sudden frenzy of preparation for our first contact with Regents—"If you don't know the answer, just say 'osmosis!" At last we emerged, ink-smudged but triumphant, as full-fledged cowhands.

Returning to take on our new responsibilities, we were gratified to find ourselves no longer the underdogs. Our more athletic members were now included in varsity sports, and many others began to assume important positions in various organizations around the ranch.

Because of their excellent work as deputies, we again elected Sally, Dave, Phil, and Marilyn to that position. True to Western tradition, we gave our version of *Oklahoma* in February, once more proving that we cowhands were talented as well as

brilliant. In April, together with the current crop of tenderfeet, (had we been that juvenile only a year ago?) we gave a very successful Blossom Prom. One event during our year as cowhands which few of us will ever forget was Mr. Herbert Hoover's dedicatory speech at the new school which had been named for him. It was a rare privilege to see in person a former President of the United States.

The first indication of our approaching glory came as the campaign for Sheriff began. There were so many capable leaders among us that a final decision was extremely difficult, but when the voting was over we all felt that a wise choice had been made in Steve Jordan.

The impossible finally happened, and we became wranglers. Steve, ably assisted by Jim Dorsch, Sally Trumble, Sue Robinson and Phil Morey, immediately demonstrated his progressiveness and skill in handling ranch affairs. Several changes were made around the ranch, among them the welcome addition of music during the lunch hour (well most of it was music). During the Fall staunch "Ike" and "Adlai" factions gave added zest to ranch life. Annual events—the Tinsel Ball, the Aquacade, the N. T. Game took on new meaning: for us, each of them was a "last time." In November the Senior Carnival, a humorous depiction of the trials and tribulations of school life, added to our reputation as "master showmen."

Class Day came, and "The Future" suddenly loomed alarmingly near. Mingled with our pride in the awards and honors that our friends were receiving, were feelings of regret at leaving the place which had meant such wonderful times to us for three years. The Senior Ball passed in a blaze of splendor. Too soon, the Big Roundup was upon us. As the familiar strains of Pomp and Circumstance sounded, we departed for the last time, hoping that, in some small way, the Class of 1953 had made a worthwhile contribution.




#### STUDENT COUNCIL








#### MARCHING BAND


#### DANCE BAND









#### SCHOLARSHIP CLUB






#### **CO-ED SWIM CLUB**




# RADIO CLUB





Numerous other subjects such as these provide an excellent background for Kenmore students.















# **VARSITY CLUB**

# **FOOTBALL**













Kenmore's football forces opened the season on a gloomy note, losing their first two games. A Friday night opening game trip to Niagara Falls saw the Blue Devils defeated by a powerful Falls team; however, the 42-19 score was no indication of the intensity of the conflict. On the Crosby Avenue gridiron the Kenmore eleven fell prey to the flat passes of the LaSalle Explorers, dropping their second game by a 34-6 count.

Not discouraged by these losses, the Blue Devils snapped a Jamestown win streak extending over four years as they stunned the Swedes with a 19-18 victory, one of the outstanding upsets of the Western New York grid season. Bobby Blount skirted end on Kenmore's first play for a sixty yard touchdown run, and Kenmore fought hard in a see-saw battle, finally to emerge the victor.

A Friday afternoon game saw the team and a large number of fans return to Hyde Park Stadium in the Falls, where Kenmore conquered Trott Vocational 12-6. North Tonawanda defeated the varsity 35-0 in the following home game, but the Blue Devils returned to the win column with a 14-12 victory as Davis' extra points again gave them a game, this time over Lockport.

Although Tonawanda was up for their game with Kenmore, they were unable to cope with good line play and fine quarterbacking by Kenmore, as the Blue defeated the Red Warriors 13-7. In the finisher with Lackawanna, Mr. Yackapovich's team dealt their opponents out of a first place tie for the Niagara Frontier League title with a hard fought win over the Steelers. The 28-14 victory gave Kenmore fourth place in league competition.

Seven Kenmore seniors gained All-Star recognition. Fred Barrett was center on the first team, Captain Bob Blount and Lou Grace made second team, and Vanich, Schramek, Kollep and Evans received honorable mention from league coaches who chose the team.

Coach Yackapovich expects to greet a good crop of former J.V. material as well as 8 returning lettermen. Under Captain Morog, he is looking forward to a promising 1953 season.
































A revenge win over Trott was led by Pray's 26 points. In the second Lockport game Kenmore astounded Western New York basketball circles with a 62–55 victory over the league-leading Lock City five. Pray was again high scorer with 28. Tonawanda tasted defeat at the hands of Kenmore for the first time in recent years when the Blue and White scored a decisive 76–48 win over a team which is always a league power to close the season.

Their five-won, nine-lost record in league action gained the team sixth place in the standings. In the final analysis Kenmore was far stronger than the record indicated, but a slow start combined with the loss of Vince Riley's full services due to injury kept the team from a greater number of victories.




# JUNIOR VARSITY SPORTS


Kenmore's three junior varsity teams will be looked to in the fall and winter of 1953 to supply the football, basketball, and swimming varsities with well-trained and experienced material.

Not only seniors, but also juniors and sophomores will remember those fine games of basketball and volleyball played in our gym.


Many girls were chosen for the basketball honor teams which competed against other schools including Buffalo Seminary, Amherst, and Cleveland Hill.
