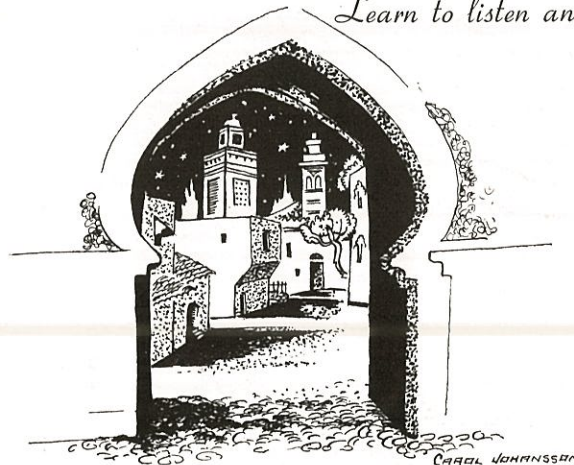
Class Poem

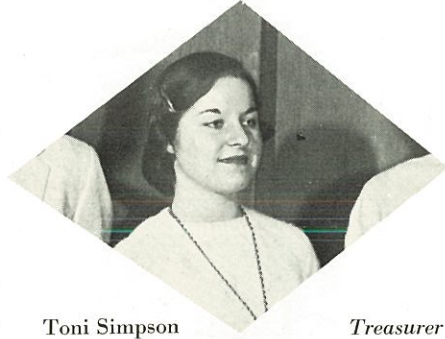
National Honor Society

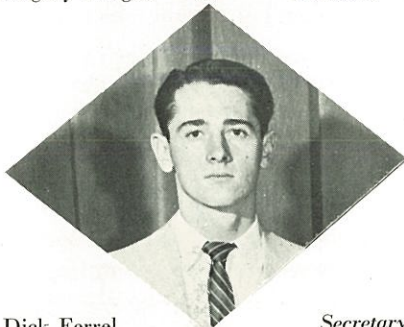
President


Class

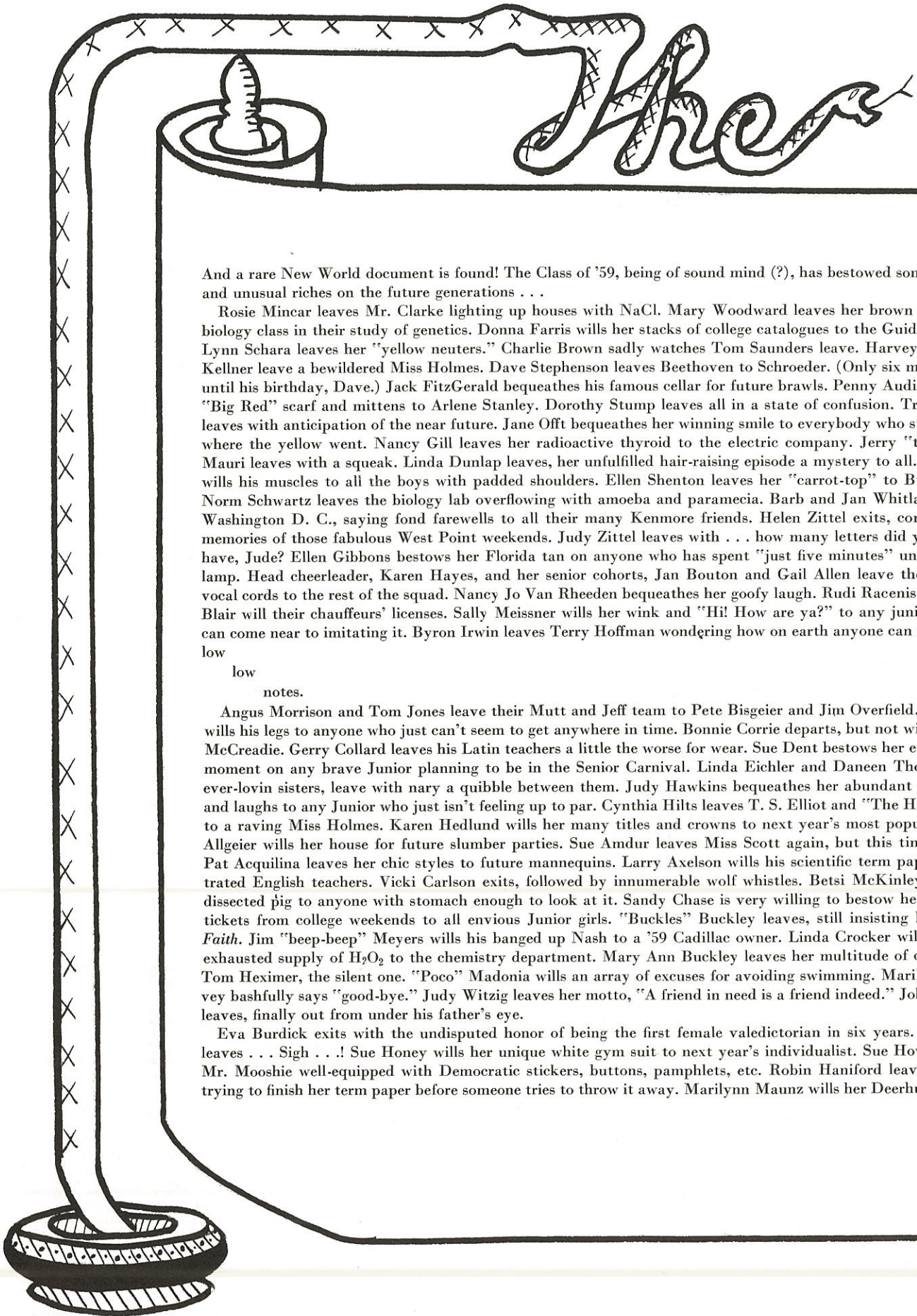


to a close with keen anticipation of the year to come.

And a rare New World document is found! The Class of '59, being of sound mind (?), has bestowed some fabulous and unusual riches on the future generations . . .

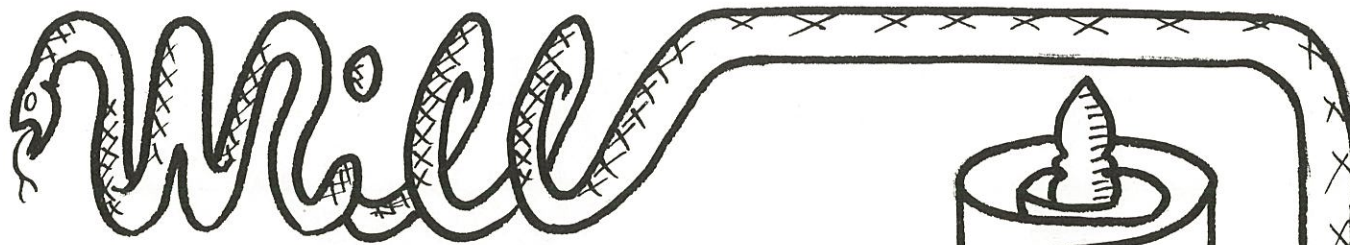

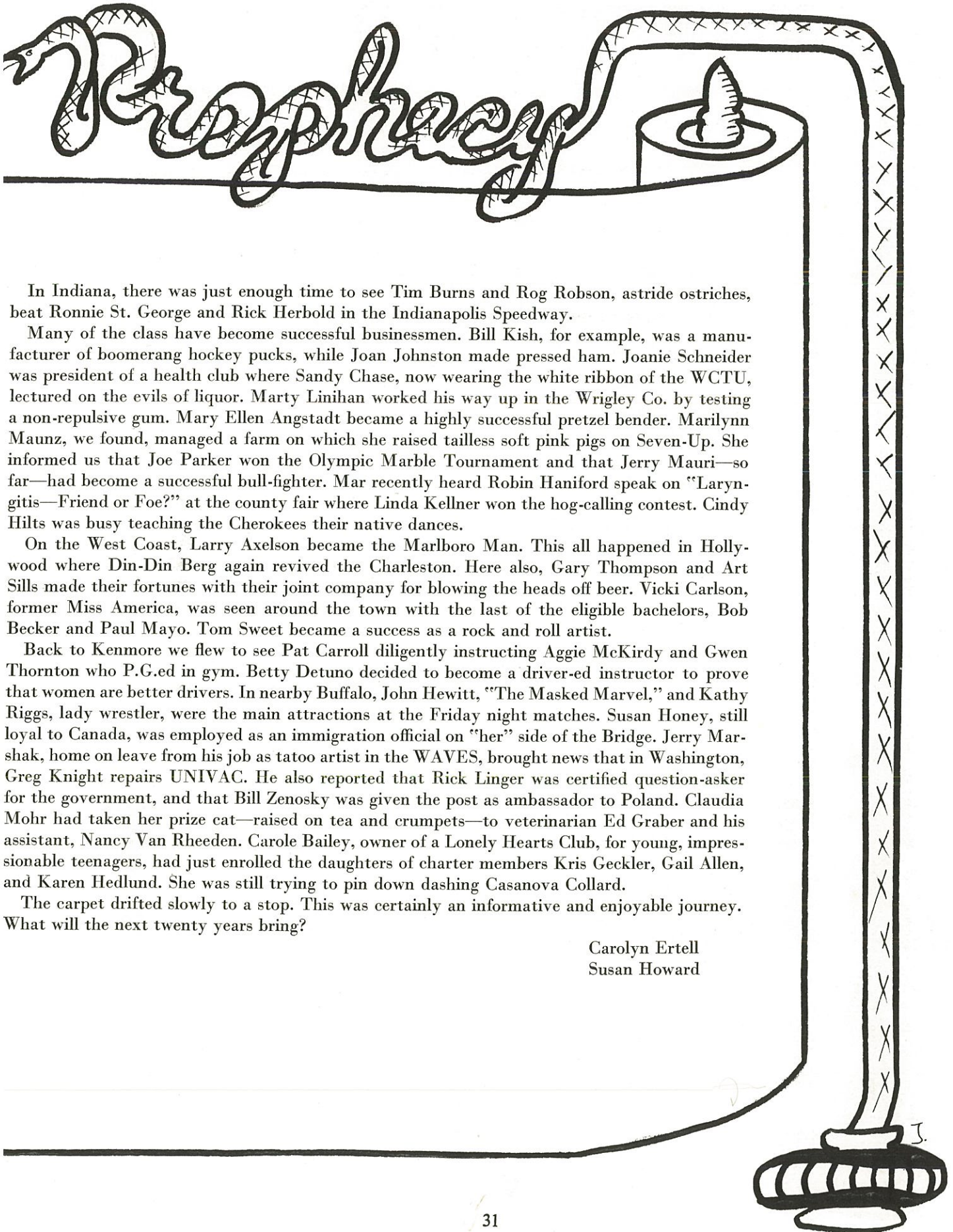
Class

Congratulations to Captain Collard and his hard fighting crew of players.



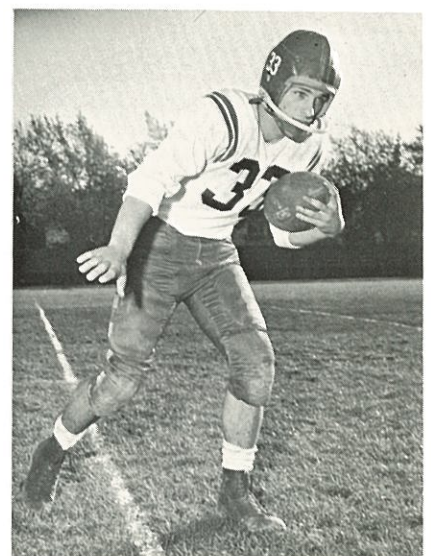
